
Statement Sunglasses Under £75






What made you decide to become a Mod?

What is one thing that most people do not know about you?


I am actually an avid sports fan. I religiously follow the Chealsea Football Club. I want people to know that I am not a one dimenonal person who only knows about film and theatre.




Add three clumpy coats of mascara to top & bottom lashes.


